WEC Track Session: Exploring Agritourism Strategies that Work for Producers and Communities: Applied Research, Case Study and Extension Resources for the Western US.

Agritourism in the US has increased substantially over the past decade. Producer income from farm-based agritourism and other recreational activities increased from \$202 million in 2002 to \$567 million in 2007 to \$704 million in 2012 (Census of Agriculture). As part of a Western region project, CSU, UC-Davis, the University of Northern Colorado and USDA-ERS explored this data further by conducting surveys of agritourism operators and agritourists to compare traveler behavior and beliefs with producer strategies. In addition to summarizing traveler behavior, and producer perceptions, case studies on strong performing regions were developed. A key point of interest for this symposium will be a discussion of outreach approaches and strategies used throughout this agritourism project. A panel of presenters will include project researchers and members of the agritourism community to facilitate discussions around extension outreach.
