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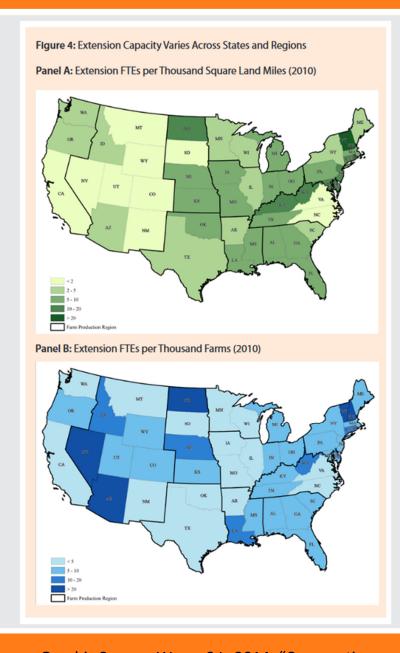
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The Challenge of Farm Bill Extension Education

- The number of FTEs associated with Extension are shrinking, and few focus primarily on Ag Policy
- Programming on Ag Policies and how they affect producers remains in demand
- If Extension doesn't provide that information for our states, where will it come from?

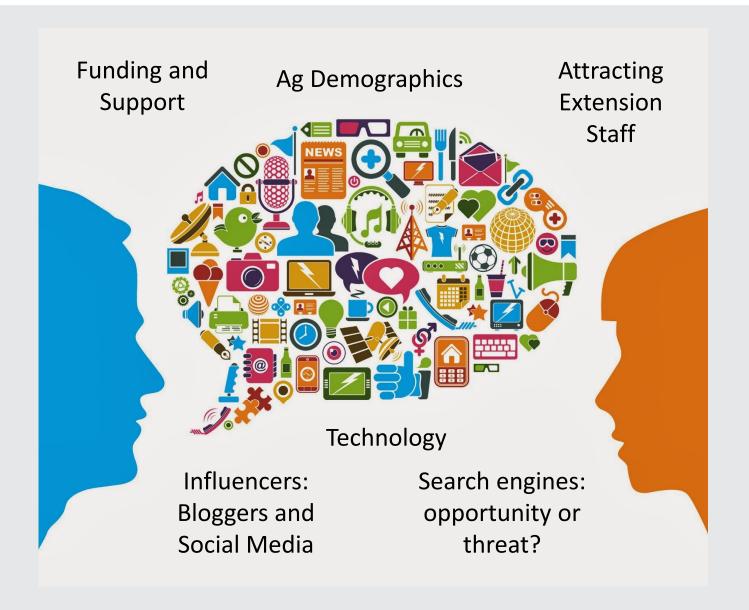
The Case for Farm Bill Programming

OSU Extension is currently:

- In the midst of a budget related restructure
- Reimagining the website interface
- Assessing how Extension information is being accessed and by whom

OSU Ag Policy

- A demand for face-to-face Farm Bill education still exists...BUT it isn't the main event in a program right now
- Virtual outlets are a good way to start in-depth conversations
- Youth are passionate Ag advocates, and they need unbiased, science-based information

What is convergent media?

 The tendency of media – computing, communication, content and consumption – to become more similar with time.







The case for convergent media in Extension

- Extension clients need to access timely and factual information, but they are overwhelmed with content.
- Extension programming needs to cut through noise to efficiently meet audiences' needs and hold their interest.

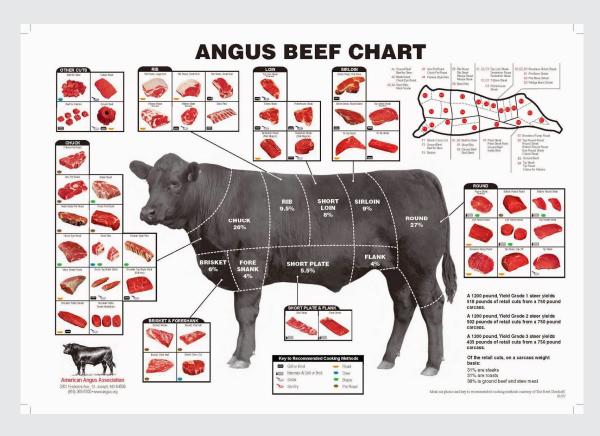
Today's multiplatform media environment often rewards innovative delivery above all else.

Value Added Media?



Economists are comfortable talking about profit maximization, differential products, and value added.

Can we apply these concepts to communications?



Our approach

 A team of agricultural communications students (as part of a capstone integrated marketing class in agricultural communications) worked under our supervision to develop a convergent media plan for Ag Policy Extension at OSU.



Their process

Tasked with strategic communication planning for OSU Ag Policy Extension, including:

- Background and Situational Analysis
- Goal and Objectives
- Key publics and Messages
- Strategies and Tactics



The a-ha moment

Initial idea was to plan marketing tactics that use convergent media more effectively to get ag policy information to more people

But it became apparent that there was a demand gap, and we had a unique opportunity to fill that gap in a way that utilizes innovative delivery



What the plan will do

Goal

Develop ag policy education resources for youth to increase policy competency.

Objectives

- 1. Develop and engage interactive agricultural policy education with 50 agricultural youth.
- 2. Implement Oklahoma Ag Policy Extension curriculum within 25 4-H programs.
- 3. Implement the use of Ag Policy Extension curriculum at 30 events and in classrooms.

Who the plan targets

- 1. Youth ages 14-18 enrolled in 4-H or Agricultural Education.
- 2. Oklahoma Extension Educators.
- 3. Extension volunteers and Oklahoma agricultural education instructors.



Tactics for Youth

- Develop ag policy curriculum specific to youth
 - Workshops/class sessions AND course units
- Create interactive educational materials using convergent media
 - Lessons and units for both face-to-face and online instruction



Tactics for Extension Educators

- Provide materials as a complete plug-and-play curriculum packet
 - Based on ongoing research about educator preferences for curriculum delivery to educators

Marketing plan to encourage Extension Educators to adopt the curriculum are forthcoming (focusing on developing materials first).



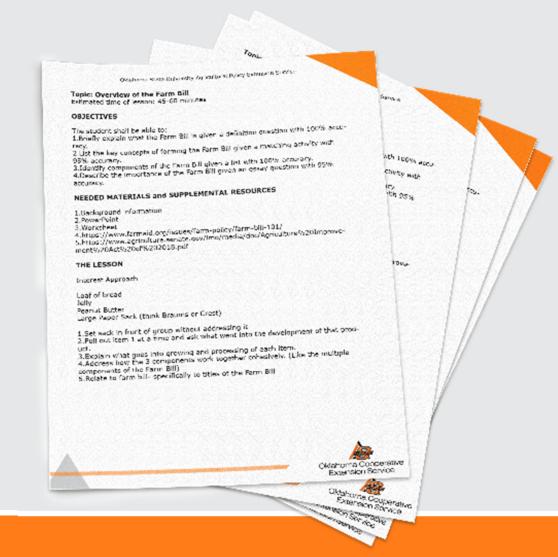
Tactics for Extension Volunteers and Agricultural Educators

- Pilot the curriculum with the Fall 2019 ag ed student teaching cohort (n=14); Test with Spring 2020 (n=31)
 - We have separate evaluation plan to help improve the curriculum
- Provide materials as a complete plug-and-play curriculum packet

Marketing plan to encourage Extension Volunteers and Agricultural Educators to adopt the curriculum are forthcoming (focusing on developing materials first).



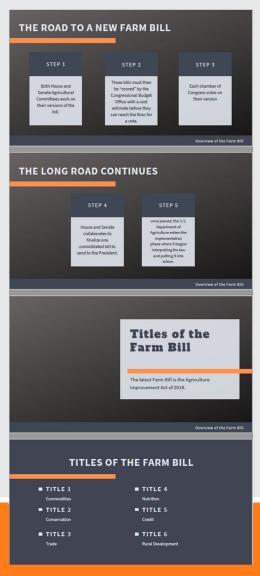

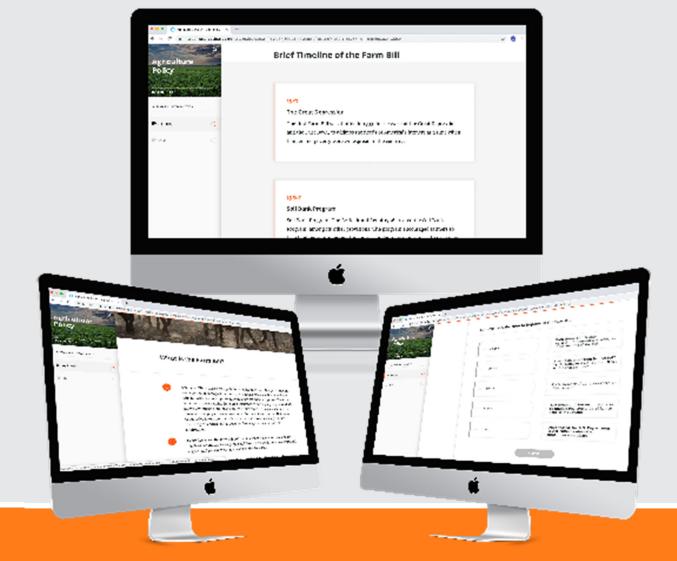

Lessons Learned

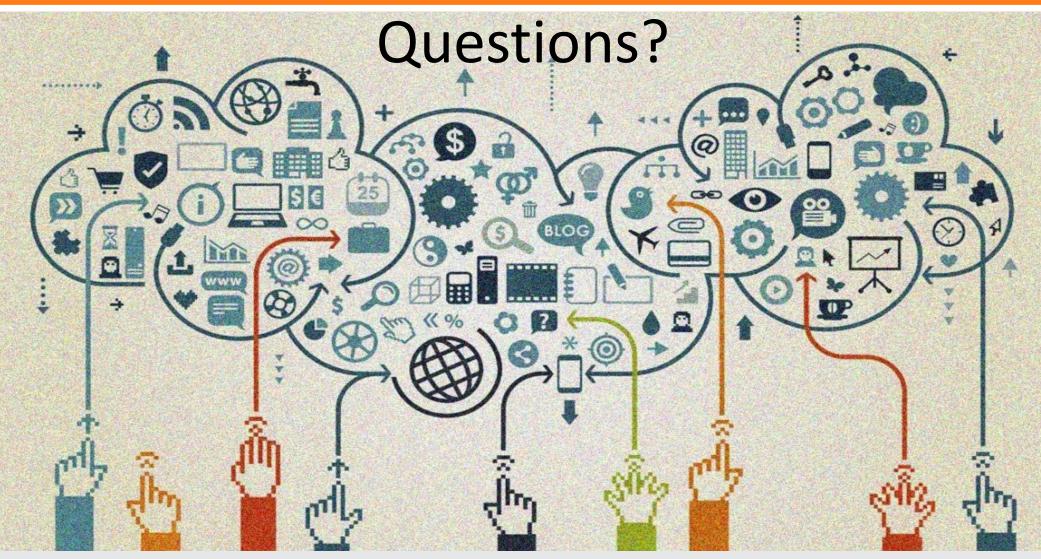
- Remain flexible. This is a learning process.
